- ✓ Be ready to make mistakes! Do not be afraid to speak up, mistakes are part of the learning process.
- √ Ask for help whenever you are having trouble understanding something.
- ✓ Make use of the library services : watching films and reading books will help you further your language skills.
- √ Be prepared to work in pairs or small groups.
- √ Be supportive to other class members and respect each other's pace of learning.
- ✓ Be **open** to your teacher's methods and trust that they know what they are doing!
